BY THE GOVERNOR OF PUERTO RICO A PROCLAMATION

To appoint the Human Resource Committee

The accelerated progress of industrialization and the expansion of the programs of economic development and of services of the Government of Puerto Rico requires that the level of education, the skills and the occupations of the people of Puerto Rico be raised, with the purpose of reaching a higher level of production and of income, and of considerably improving the techniques of modern society. The actual want of skilled personnel which is noticed in the government circles and in private economy makes this need evident.

For this reason, I do hereby appoint a Human Resource Committee, which duty shall be to evaluate the existing needs of trained personnel, and the resources required to take care of them, to formulate standard ways of acting for the Government, and to coördinate the activities of the Government agencies to meet the needs of said program.

The Committee shall consist of the heads of the following agencies:

Office of Personnel
Bureau of the Budget
University of Puerto Rico
Department of Education
Department of Agriculture and Commerce
Department of Finance
The Planning Board
Economic Development Administration
Department of Labor

The said Committee shall be presided over by the Director of Personnel who shall provide the necessary personnel to organize a permanent secretary's office of the same.

Among others the Committee shall have the following duties: (1) to evaluate in detail the needs of trained personnel in all the aspects of the skill, in the Government circles as well as in private economy; (2) to take inventory of the resources available to provide the needed training, to consider its potentialities and the obstacles existing for its proper functioning; (3) to formulate a government norm relative to the development of our human resources, based on this inventory of the needs and of the available resources; (4) by means of the activities of the Committee, to take the necessary measures to assure a close and continous cooperation between the agencies to realize this program; (5) to periodically

inform the Governor of the activities the Committee is carrying on, and submit him recommendations when the Committee deems it advisable to determine norms which extend the authority of the existing agencies.

This Committee should meet at least once a month, or as often as required by its business and it shall be able to draw up and approve those rules and regulations which they consider necessary for a better attainment of their goal.
