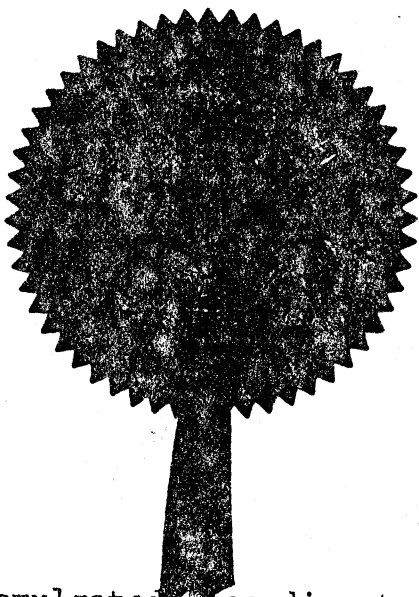
A PROCLAMATION

Mothers' Day, 1954

WHEREAS, the second Sunday of May each year has been designated as Mothers' Day by Act No. 25 of 1915, which directed the Governor to remind the people of its observance;

NOW THEREFORE, I, LUIS MUÑOZ MARIN, Governor of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, do hereby remind all the inhabitants of this Island that Sunday, May 9, is the day fixed by law as Mothers' Day this year, for paying homage to home and motherhood by reviving remembrance of the mothers who have died and gladdening the existence of those who are still living, through demonstrations of love, by suitable services, in churches and other religious and civic organizations, and by wearing the emblematic honeysuckle suggested by the Legislature as an external manifestation of joy in the sublime ideal commemorated.
