BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PUERTO RICO  
AN EXECUTIVE ORDER ON THE DESIGNATION OF AN AGENCY  
IN CHARGE OF THE PLAN FOR ACQUISITION AND DISPOSAL  
OF FEDERAL SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY

By virtue of authority vested in me as Governor, I, Luis Muñoz Marín, hereby designate the "Service Office of the Government of Puerto Rico", under the Department of Finance, as the agency in charge of the plan of operation for the acquisition and disposal of surplus personal property for the use of health and educational institutions and units of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, eligible under the provisions of Section 203(j) of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949.

In carrying out the purposes of this Order, the Service Office is authorized and directed to—

I.— Develop practices, in cooperation with the United States of America, relating to transfer, warehousing, distribution and accountability of personal property donated for the benefit of public health and educational establishments pursuant to Section 203(j), in compliance with agreements executed under the authority and final approval of the Governor

within the purview of Act No. 46, of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, approved on September 27, 1949.

II.— Distribute to said public medical, health and educational units surplus property so donated, charging fees reasonably related to the costs of care and handling in respect to its acquisition, receipt, warehousing, distribution or transfer and the maintenance of a reasonable operating reserve.

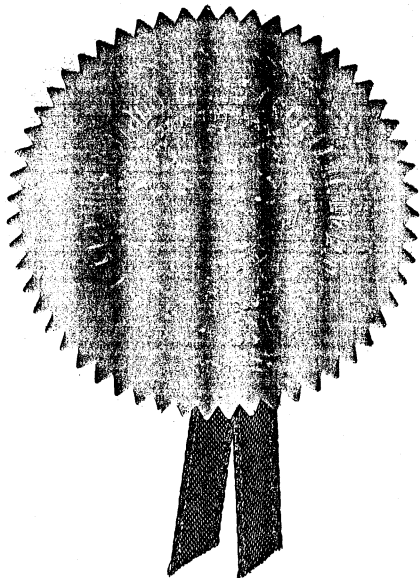
III.— Adopt, amend or rescind such rules as may be deemed necessary in conformity with federal requirements.

IV.— Act as clearing house of information for the public institutions and units eligible under Section 203(j).


V.— Take such action, make such expenditures within available appropriations, keep such records, require such reports and make such investigations —within statutory bounds— as may be required by the laws or regulations of the United States of America.

VI.— Appoint advisory boards and committees.


VII.— Cooperate to the fullest extent —consistent with the law— with the departments and agencies of the United States of America and comply with the laws of the United States of America governing the allocation, transfer, use of, or accounting for, property donable or donated to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.
