A PROCLAMATION

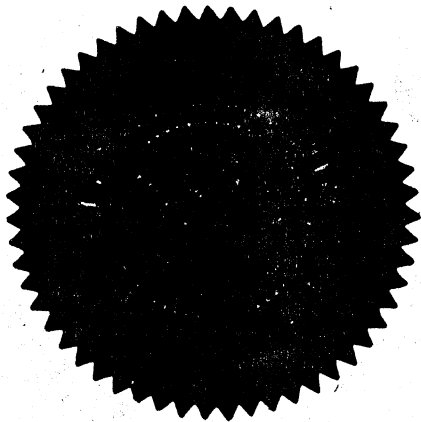
Girl Scout Week

WHEREAS, the 7,853 girls affiliated with this organization guide their lives by the noble principles of loyalty, honesty, courtesy, optimism, usefulness and kindness;

WHEREAS, the leaders of this group merit public recognition for their valuable contribution to the welfare of the community through their work with Puerto Rican youth;

NOW THEREFORE, I, LUIS MUÑOZ MARIN, Governor of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, do hereby proclaim the period of March 11 to 17 as Girl Scout Week, and March 12 as the Forty-Fourth anniversary of its organization in the United States of America, and I ask all the citizens to lend their cooperation and assistance to the Girl Scouts of Puerto Rico, in the present as well as in the years to come, so that the Organization may continue its progress in benefit of Puerto Rico's youth.
