## BY THE GOVERNOR OF PUERTO RICO A PROCLAMATION

Referendum for the approval or refusal of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico (La Constitución del Estado Libre Asociado de Puerto Rico)

WHEREAS, it has been determined by law that the third day of March, 1952 has been set aside as the day in which a referendum is to be held to determine whether the people of Puerto Rico approve or refuse the Constitution of Puerto Rico (La Constitución del Estado Libre Asociado de Puerto Rico), approved by the Constituent Convention on February 4, 1952;

WHEREAS, considering the importance of this poll for the people of Puerto Rico, March 3, 1952 has been declared a legal holiday so that all Puertorricans qualified to vote may exercise this right as citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUIS MUÑOZ MARIN, Governor of Puerto Rico, in accordance with the provisions set by law do hereby announce by means of this proclamation that Monday, March 3, 1952 a referendum shall be held in Puerto Rico to determine whether the people of Puerto Rico approve or refuse the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico (La Constitución del Estado Libre Asociado de Puerto Rico), approved by the Constituent Convention, and during that day all public offices and commercial, industrial or professional establishments, shall remain closed as for general election day in Puerto Rico.

I urge all citizens qualified to vote to attend the polls in that day to perform a civic duty.

unto set my hand, and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of Puerto Rico, at the City of San Juan, on this fifteenth day of February, A.D., nineteen hundred and fifty two.
