BY THE GOVERNOR OF PUERTO RICO A PROCLAMATION

Mothers' Day, 1952

WHEREAS, the second Sunday of May each year has been designated as Mothers' Day by Act No. 25 of 1915, which directed the Governor to remind the people of its observance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, VICTOR GUTIERREZ FRANQUI, Acting Governor of Puerto Rico, do hereby remind all the inhabitants of this Island that Sunday, May 11, is the day fixed by law as Mother's Day this year, for paying homage to home and motherhood by reviving remembrance of the mothers who have died and gladdening the existance of those who are still living, through demonstrations of love, by suitable services in churches and other religious and civic organizations, and by wearing the emblematic honeysuckle suggested by the Legislature as an external manifestation of joy in the sublime ideal commemorated.
