
Holidays for the Employees of the Government of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico During the Festivities of Christmas, New Year and Three Kings Day

WHEREAS, December 24 and 31 are Christmas and New Year's Eve; Friday January 2, 1953 is the Governor's Inauguration Day; and Monday January 5 is the eve of the Three Kings Day; each of them being a workable day;

WHEREAS, three of these workable days precede and one follows a holiday, --Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Three Kings Day-thus breaking the continuity of the working periods bringing as a
result a minor utilization of those workable days and even of the
mentioned holidays;

WHEREAS, it is convenient that the employees of the Common-wealth of Puerto Rico may enjoy two holiday periods, the first, from Wednesday 24 at noon until Thursday December 25 inclusive, and the second, from Thursday 1st. until Tuesday January 6, 1953, also inclusive.

NOW THEREFORE, I, LUIS MUÑOZ MARIN, Governor of the Common-wealth of Puerto Rico, by virtue of the faculty conferred upon me. by law, DO HEREBY DECLARE as holidays for the employees of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, its public agencies and instrumentalities, the two periods mentioned above; Providing, however that the employees affected by this executive order will have to work all day Saturday December 20 and 27, 1952. The heads of all government units herein included, shall take the pertinent care so that the minimum personnel needed remains in their respective agencies to attend to any urgent matter that may be brought to the attention of the same according to the needs of public service.



IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, at the City of San Juan, this 15 day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-two.
