A PROCLAMATION

Day of the Blind, 1954

WHEREAS, we should display the greatest zeal in helping our fellow citizens who are sightless to discover in our affection, in our concern for their welfare, and in our esteem the proof that they can contribute effectively to our community's progress;

WHEREAS, we should promote their education and abilities so as to make extensive use of their other capacities, thus enlarging their sphere of action;

WHEREAS, by enabling them to contribute more to our community, we shall be infusing them with more self-reliance;

NOW THEREFORE, I, LUIS MUÑOZ MARIN, Governor of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, proclaim December 13th as Day of the Blind, and I recommend that all public and private institutions engaged in the care and training of blind children and adults hold activities aimed at promoting their education, and I call upon our people to lend their wholehearted cooperation to this praiseworthy undertaking.
